Finally, Individual Journeys is a new FFI concept that people have asked about for a long time. This is explained on the website: my.friendshipforce.org -- but in a nutshell, a person/host decides what they could offer an ambassador who'd want to do what the host is providing, so host would post it on FFI's Individual Journeys area of their website and include dates or those could be negotiated, and then somebody wanting to visit that area for a short time, an ambassador, would answer that posting, the two would be matched up, and it would result in another kind of peacemaking among strangers from around the world. It would be especially nice for an individual FFI member who feels they can't be very involved in ongoing activities but wants to invite a person(s) into their home for maybe a few nights and has an agenda they could follow to show the ambassador around their local area. The ambassador pays FFI the nightly fee as usual; FFI is involved and lists the journey. It sounds fascinating!!
